



Justin Hall (All Thumbs Press) argues that transgendered characters in the work of Neil Gaiman, Grant Morrison, and Alan Moore break apart conventional notions of identity, imagination, time, sex, and death to create a bit of chaos, and perhaps enlightenment in the process. David James Cordes (California Baptist University) sees a mimetic application for the adolescent male of the transformations of the adolescent Clark Kent in SMALLVILLE and John Connor in the TERMINATOR films into heroes.
