Happy 50TH Comic-Con!

PRISM Comics would like to take this opportunity to salute the staff of Comic-Con International on its 50th Birthday and recognize Comic-Con International for their ongoing commitment to diversity. Over the decades the staff of Comic-Con International has repeatedly shown their support for marginalized voices and made their call for diversity in representation loud and proud!

According to comics historian/demigoddess Trina Robbins, the first "Women In Comics" panel was at a Berkeley Con in 1973 and included contributors to Wimmen's Comix and Tits & Clits: Joyce Farmer, Lyn Chevely, Pat Moodian, Sharon Rudahl, Lee Marrs, and Trina Robbins. By the 1980s and 1990s, San Diego Comic-Con began scheduling Women in Comics panels semi-frequently, and the non-profit group Friends of Lulu was founded 25 years ago at the Con.

In 1988, Andy Mangels proposed a "Gays In Comics" panel to SDCC. They not only accepted it (from a relative industry newbie), but they scheduled it for a 90-minute panel at the Civic Theatre! That first panel featured Max Allan Collins, Terry Beatty, Roberta Gregory, Mike Grell, John Ostrander, Kay Reynolds, Robert Triptow, and Kate Worley, moderated by Mangels. The panel - now known as "Out In Comics" - is in its 32nd year this year (still on Saturdays and still moderated by Andy Mangels) and is the longest-running comic convention panel in world history!

In 1998 - five years after he co-founded Milestone Comics (an imprint of DC Comics dedicated to minority representation) - Michael Davis started "The Black Panel" at SDCC. There had been some previous "Blacks in Comics" panels at the Con, but Davis' panel has since become a long-running institution.

This year, Comic-Con International has panels dedicated to Women, Blacks, Chicanos, Filipinx, the Disabled, East Indians, Native Americans, Indigenous South Americans, Christians, Muslims, and even Mormons. CCI also has Special Guests who range all over the gender, skin color and orientation spectrums. And this year there are a whopping 11 panels specifically geared toward the LGBTQ community!

PRISM Comics and the LGBTQ creators and fans that it supports wish the Con its staff Happy Anniversary, many thanks and best wishes for the years to come!





PRISM THROUGH THE YEARS



In 1988, an article I wrote for *Amazing Heroes* magazine — "Out of the Closet and Into The Comics" caused a seismic shift in the industry and discussions that reverberated in editorial meetings and among fans; that year, I also chaired the first-ever **GAYS IN COMICS** panel at San Diego Comic-Con. I was the first "mainstream" creator "out" in the field, though incredible and brave predecessors such as **Howard Cruse**, **Lee Marrs**, **Roberta Gregory**, **Alison Bechdel**, **Robert Triptow**, **Tim Barela**, and others had paved the way in the pages of underground comix and queer newspapers.

By 1999, the narrative had changed significantly, and queer creators were coming out more often, two gay comic clubs had formed (ATDNSIN and Northstar), and online forums such as Gay League were in their early days. I self-published the first **OUT IN COMICS** zine, a 16-page booklet with bios of 39 LGBT comic creators. The following year saw others—**Kyle Minor** and **Charles "Zan" Christensen**—jump in to help design and produce a new volume with 51

16 pages, photocopied, with bios of 40 creators and a timeline of LGBTQ+ comics

creator bios and queer comic resources. 2001 saw a jump to 36 pages and the addition of help from **Joe Palmer** and **Dwayne Best**. That year, I was working with new publisher

Out In Comics guides, 2000, 2001, 2002

Jai Sen, and asked him to help me create a new non-profit group to publish a yearly guide at each Comic-Con, and to promote LGBTQ+ creators and comics. The group began initially with Jai Sen, Kyle Minor, Joe Palmer, Charles "Zan" Christensen, and myself, all volunteers. The group crystallized in 2002 to create the new OUT IN COMICS group, complete with a logo, a website, and a 52-page comic-format magazine!

By 2003, the group changed its name to **PRISM Comics**, with the tagline "Seeing Comics in a different light!" and Zan took over as president. 2003 was also the first year that PRISM had a booth at Comic-Con (shared with Jai Sen's Shoto Press), and it was the





first year we did two panels and a Gay Agenda giveaway in addition to our yearbook. Over the years, PRISM has sponsored awards, given out the Queer Press Grant, has published books, has exhibited at conventions all across the country, and has nurtured the careers of literally hundreds of gueer comic creators. It has done so with the support of you, dear readers, but also an immense number of volunteers. I can't list everyone or we'd be going on for pages, but in addition to the above co-founders, I want to give a special shout-out to Patty Jeres, Roger Klorese, Tara Madison Avery, and

most especially Ted Abenheim (who has been the group's most active supporter since 2005)!

In today's world, we need heroes, and I'm here to tell you that in the 16 years of PRISM Comics and the four years of its predecessor, we have been witness to real heroes, both among creators and volunteers. It's fitting that last year, GAYS IN **COMICS** was renamed **OUT IN COMICS** and blissfully melded with the multi-colored spectrum that is **PRISM Comics!** This year, for its 32nd year, it remains the longest-running comic convention panel in world history!
